Aide Memoire : Some food for thought .

(For the Review Group)

I.Process .

In terms of process , we are currently engaged in two parallel but closely interlinked tracks : developing a recovery plan for Acoliland , and conducting consultations with key stakeholders . Concerning the latter , we have , so far , met with the leaders of Wang-OO and ARLPI . A meeting is scheduled with MPs & ministers for 11 September . We also are in the process of organising consultations with the leaders of the following constituencies : Local government ; women ; Ludito Dog Kaka ; and youth .

The outcomes from the twin tracks will feed into a seminal plenary gathering , scheduled for Pongdwongo , at the close of December .

What should be presented at Pongdwongo , and what should be envisaged as outcomes of that critical gathering ?

II. Appropriate arrangement /entity/structure .

As we continue this critical work , an important question is hanging over us .<u>Where</u> exactly will these efforts at roco Paco lead to ? Under which arrangement/auspices/entity will agreed actions/ interventions and follow-up be carried out ?

A secondary question we need to address is : What shall we call the document we are currently developing ?

III. Approach & Perspective .

i.<u>Bold interventions</u>. In designing our response to the current situation in Acoliland , we should certainly try known & tested intervention-tools from known & tested tool-box . However , we should not be afraid to reach out for bold & unusual intervention-tools , commensurate with the nature , duration & magnitude of the unprecedented catastrophic breakdown in Acoliland . This is critical because , in virtually all the domains envisaged for interventions , we have to rebuild , resurrect/restore , reimagine - - and then transform. In sum , we must imagine the rebirth of Acoli society .

ii.<u>Compelling narrative</u>. We need a compelling & consistent narrative. The actual facts on the ground speak very loudly to this. Thankfully, there is no need for any contrived narratives.

In this connection, we might take note of Pastor Patience Rwabwogo's poignant message during her recent "Light up Acoliland for Jesus " crusade, and her father's plea to " the people of Acoli". "As the top leader of NRM, I am here to take full responsibility for all the mistakes which were made at various levels in this subregion. Forgive our failures and mistakes . . . For this, we ask for forgiveness ".

iii. <u>Countervailing impact of "the intangibles"</u> .We should be conscious that the "intangibles" in us will, willy-nilly, counteract all proposed interventions. We need to reflect on the import of this, and what we should do in anticipation & consequence. "The intangibles " remains the thousand-pounds elephant in our house.

iv.<u>Assess previous interventions</u>. We need to assess what worked (or did not work) from previous interventions in the situation in Acoliland; these will provide instructive lessons for interventions we may propose.

v.<u>Comparisons with past records</u>. Our analysis should include appropriate data comparisons of the status quo with recorded profiles of previous eras .

vi.<u>Historical examples of loss/tragedy & renewal</u>. We need to study other historical examples of loss/tragedy & renewal . These might include : German , Japanese , Igbo , Tamil , Jewish & Palestinian historical experiences .

vii.<u>Community solidarity as engine of investment & enterprise</u>.We should seek to understand the examples of the Ismaili community, Somali community, Jewish community, Igbo community, Eritrean community, several Asian communities, etc.

vii. <u>Critical constituencies for us</u>. In our quest, all stakeholders are important. However, for us to succeed in this enterprise, the absolutely critical constituencies for us are : Ludito Dog Kaka; Women; Youth; and the Diaspora (see Remits).

viii. <u>Redesign & renew relationships with neighbours</u>. We need to redesign & renew our relationships with neighbouring communities, especially: Lango; West Nile; Karamoja; and Teso

IV. Initiatives to consider.

Here are some possible initiatives to consider .

- i. Roco Paco Scholarship Fund .
- ii. Teach for Acoli
- iii. Mentor for Acoli
- iv. Arts Festival (Biennale)
- v. By-laws/ ordinances, to be adopted at district & Dog Kaka levels, concerning consumption of alcohol & jai, conduct that breach gwok (taboos), school attendance, work during cwir, unregulated & rampant use of chemicals in agriculture, etc.
- vi. A pan-Acoli private investment vehicle
- vii. Database of intelligentsia ,etc

viii. Annual careers festival, for secondary & university students.

- ix. Special project for reviving Pongdwongo (and possibly other historical public schools)
- **x.** Annual youth convention

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
