Initial Steps

Follow-up to consultative meeting held at CJ's residence on 12 February.

On 12 February , 2023 , a consultative meeting was held at CJ's residence in Nakasero . The purpose of the informal get-together was to collectively reflect on the present catastrophe (*too paco*) which has engulfed Acoliland .

This note (**Initial Steps)** puts forward some steps that need to be taken as initial follow-up to the discussion of 12 February .

<u>Step One</u>. A small consultation (perhaps no more than 10 participants) to be held in Kampala, by mid-March, to do a quick review of **Initial Steps**.

<u>Step Two</u>. The co-chairs will request particular experts to prepare action papers (APs) on several key sectors of concern. The requests will be addressed to leading experts, possessing deep knowledge and experience of their respective fields. Typically, the APs should consist of : background information and analysis ; present state-of-affairs (status quo) ; and recommendations for response i.e. modes of response and concrete response actions. It is recommended that an AP should not be more than 10 pages in length. For the most part, this exercise should not entail original research ; rather , it should involve reviewing , assembling and distilling of existing information and knowledge , most of which are in the public domain. The APs should be submitted to the co-chairs by mid-April.

The following ten sectors are proposed for preparation of the first batch of APs : Economy (overall situation) ; Agriculture ; Land (land-ownership , land-selling , land-grabbing , land-disputes (mostly internal) , land usage , etc ; Education (particularly primary & secondary schooling) ; Youth ; Oil & Gas ; Public health ; Alcoholism ; Environment ; Leadership ; Language ; Diaspora .

Most of the above sectors have been chosen to address some of the glaring and enormous tangible deficits in Acoliland . It should be noted that , in the first selection of APs , issues pertaining to the collapse of intangible soft power assets in the community have largely been left out . These will be addressed separately below , under Step Five .

<u>Step Three</u>. The co-chairs will send out, by end of March, an update note to the participants of 12 February, informing them of steps being taken as follow-up to that consultation.

<u>Step Four</u>. The co-chairs will reach out and convene mini consultations (perhaps each consultation limited to no more than 50 representatives)

upcountry , with selected representatives of some categories of opinion-leaders in the community .

The purpose of the mini consultations will be to inform and sensitise selected opinion-leaders about the consultation and reflections of 12 February , and to elicit their own perspectives and suggestions . Not least , these mini consultations will also help shape our response to the paramount challenge of the collapse of intangible soft-power assets .

It is proposed that the initial selection of opinion-leaders should include the following categories : *Rwodi ; wegi-kom me kaka* and elders ; teachers and youth ; entrepreneurs ; local elected leaders (LC chairs & councillors) ; religious leaders ; representatives of the Diaspora .

<u>Step Five</u> . At the start of the process envisaged in Step Four , the co-chairs will request a team of five notables to prepare an AP on response to the key aspects of the collapse of intangible soft power in the community (i.e. community mentality , community outlook , community conduct , community discipline , community work ethic , parenting within families , community solidarity , *nyeko & col-cwiny* within the community , etc) . Among other things , the team will closely follow discussions in the mini consultations . This AP should be in by mid-June .

<u>Step Six</u>. By end of June, the co-chairs will convene a second consultative meeting in CJ's compound; this gathering could be enlarged to 80 participants. This meeting will do three things: review concrete recommendations from the APs, review insights from the mini consultations, and discuss the plan for convening a plenary gathering of the community upcountry.

<u>Step Seven</u>. The authors of the APs will revise their papers and finalise recommendations, in light of reflections from the second consultative meeting, and in preparation for plenary meeting.

<u>Step Eight</u>. A plenary meeting of community opinion-leaders will be convened upcountry before end of October ; a summary of recommendations and a plan for the 'way forward' will be submitted to this gathering .

<u>Initial Fundraising</u>. Some initial fundraising will be necessary, to cover some aspects of the activities outlined above. For this reason, following Step One, the co-chairs will request a small team (perhaps composed of three persons) to explore and prepare initial funding proposals, to cover several aspects of the activities envisaged above.
